Ph.D. in Forest Ecology, University of Wisconsin-Madison

Lee Frelich is Director of the University of Minnesota Center for Hardwood Ecology. He teaches courses in Forest Fire Ecology and Landscape Ecology at the university. He has advised 18 graduate students, and is a senior member of the Conservation Biology, Natural Resource Science and Management, Ecology, and Invasive Species Graduate Programs.

Frelich has published numerous papers on forest ecology and has been listed among the top 1% of all scientists in the world in the Science Citation Index, Ecology and Environment Category. He has appeared in the news media 200 times including *The New York Times*, *Newsweek*, *National Geographic*, and many TV and radio stations.

Current research interests include fire and wind in boreal forests, long-term dynamics of old-growth hemlock and maple forests, invasive earthworms in forests, and global warming
